
What to wear?

Homework



- Homework will typically consist of a maths worksheet, an assignment on Spelling Shed – all children will have their login details in their reading diaries – weekly spellings and some Times Table Rockstars practice is always encouraged to help develop children's multiplication skills.
- Each half term there may also be a home learning project that relates to the current topic. Children will have the whole half term to work on their project. Please check for letters at the beginning of each term for further details.
- Please support children with home learning.


Reading

Is teaching about:



Teaching about equality helps our children to prepare for the next stages in their lives.


Two of the ways we teach about equality is through the use of books and also a halftermly collective worship where we focus on something from the media that highlights inequality and 'No Outsiders'.





Trips

- Our residential to Runways End in March (5/3-8/3) is already booked. The children are already very excited.
- We will be carrying out some data collection around the local area as part of our geography unit.
- We will be visiting our local library over the next few weeks.
- There will be other trips throughout the year and will inform you of these when details are finalised.

SATS

Monday 13th May – Thursday 16th May

- SATS test your child's understanding of the Key Stage Two curriculum.
- Tests are carried out in: reading, maths and spelling punctuation and grammar.
- Writing is teacher assessed.
- After the tests in May, SATS are externally marked and results come back in July.
- Tests are carried out in classroom a environment. Some children will have adult support if they usually receive support in class.
- Children with Special Education Needs will receive adult support.
- Look out for information regarding a SATS meeting for parents later on in the year!

Transition to secondary school

- We work very closely with secondary schools- particularly Bay House and Brune Park. Staff members will visit the children over the year and will have meetings with your child's current teacher to pass any relevant information.
- We have not been informed of transition dates yet however will let you know towards the end of the year.
- You can apply online for your child's place. Applications for secondary school open on 11 September 2023. The deadline for applications is October 31st 2023.
