Pupil Premium Information 2018 -2019

Pupil Premium funding is additional to main school funding provided to schools. Its purpose is to address potential underlying attainment inequalities in schools by raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities to reach their potential and supporting children and young people with parents in the regular armed forces.

The Pupil Premium Grant for 2018-19 is based on the January school census of each academic year and is allocated to:

- Pupils recorded in the January 2018 school census that are known to have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) since May 2012, as well as those first known to be eligible at January 2018.
- Pupils recorded in the January 2018 school census known to be looked after – Looked After Children (LAC)
- Pupils known to be adopted from care or who have left care under a Special Guardianship or Residence Order (Post-LAC)
- Ever 6 service child means a pupil recorded in the January 2018 school census who was eligible for the service child premium since the January 2013 census as well as those recorded as a service child for the first time on the January 2018 school census.

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) per pupil for 2018-19 is as follows

Pupils in Year Groups R to 6 recorded as Ever 6 FSM	£,1320
Looked After Children (LAC)	£2,300
Children adopted from care under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 and children who have left care under a Special Guardianship or Residence Order	£2,300
Service children	£300
Pupils recorded as Ever 6 Service Child or in receipt of a child pension from the Ministry of Defence	

Schools decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility. However, schools are accountable for how they have used this additional funding to support pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds.
