What is the Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium was introduced by the Department for Education in 2011 as additional funding in order to address the underlying inequalities for potentially vulnerable groups and individuals. These include those eligible for free school meals, those who are Looked After Children (LAC) and those from services families. The Government also decided that eligibility for the Pupil Premium in 2012-15 would be extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last **6** years. Funding for service families in 2015 has been extended to those who have been in the services at any point over the last **4** years. This service premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of pupils and to ensure successful continuity of education for children of service families.

In the year 2015-2016 -, 38% of our pupils were eligible for free school meals under the Ever 6 FSM funding . 3.4% were from services families and therefore eligible for the Ever 4 Service Children funding. The total additional funding for 2015-2016 was \pounds 199,302.

This year (2016-2017) 26% of our pupils are eligible for Ever 6 FSM and LAC funding and 2.1% are eligible for the Ever 4 Service children funding. The total additional funding for this year is £135,000
