Topics covered

In year 6, we cover a range of topics including: WW2, Evolution and Inheritance, Crime and Punishment across the Ages and Pig Heart Boy.

Year 6

Year 6 is a milestone moment for children, as it's the final year of key stage 2 and for many, the last year of primary education. In addition to continued development of a more complex understanding across all subjects, preparation for the key stage 2 SATs is key this year. The tests consist of six papers that are standardised across the country and all administered at the same time. Results are used to identify areas of need.

Morning Routine
